

Therapeutic Listening

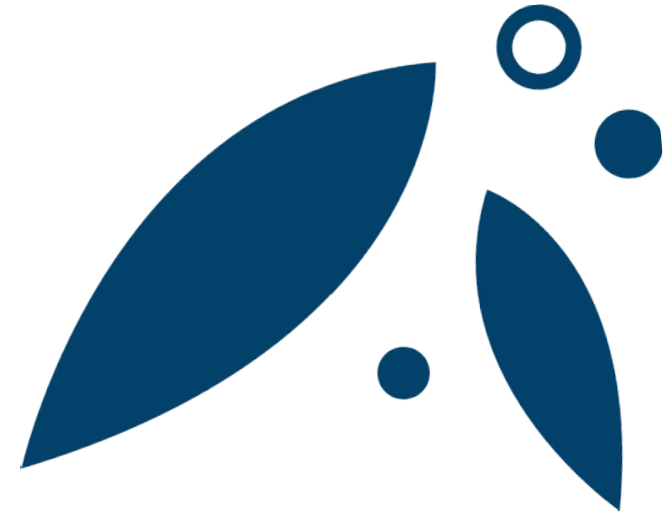
Therapeutic listening is an intervention used with sensory integration principles to enable occupational therapists to more directly address the auditory and vestibular systems. It assists children with listening, motor planning, sensory, auditory and processing difficulties.

Through the use of electronically altered or enhanced music and specialized equipment, the therapist and family can design a program to help children in the areas of :

- Focus/attention
- Sensory processing and self-regulation
- Motor planning
- Auditory processing/filtering
- Body awareness
- Balance, coordination and quality of movement
- Sequencing/communication
- Problem solving
- Visual motor integration and handwriting
